



INTERNAL MEDICINE SELECTS BEST PRESENTATIONS

UKZN's Division of [Internal Medicine](#) recently held its final grand round during which six doctors presented interesting medical cases.

It was the culmination of a series of weekly presentations held throughout the academic year featuring interns and registrars presenting interesting cases or conditions encountered at each of the training hospitals in KwaZulu-Natal.

The forums were attended by professors, consultants, medical officers, interns, registrars and Medical students.

The three best presentations for the year by interns and the three best by registrars are selected to compete for the top prize during the final grand round.

Top interns this year were Dr Daniel Laas, who presented a case of rhabdomyolysis and acute kidney injury; Dr Natasha Laloo, who showcased an unusual ovarian Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma, and Dr Saxony Moolman, who presented a rare pituitary gonadotropinoma.

A community service medical officer from R.K Khan Hospital, Dr Dane Perumal, presented a rare case of diffuse large B-cell lymphoma.

The two Registrars selected were Dr Shaun-Ray Temmers of Endocrinology at Grey's Hospital in Pietermaritzburg, who presented a patient with Sheehan Syndrome, and Dr Kumari Naidoo who presented on chronic kidney disease with an arthritis mimic on behalf of Rheumatology.

The presentations by Naidoo and Lalloo were selected as the best.

During prize-giving, [Professor Bilkish Cassim](#) of the [Department of Geriatrics](#) congratulated the Head of the Division of Internal Medicine, [Dr Nombulelo Magula](#), on her new appointment as Professor of Internal Medicine.
